WHAT PRODUCTS SHOULD I BRING?

Look for the words **Caution, Warning, Poison, Corrosive, Toxic, Volatile, Flammable or Danger** on the label; also, mercury-containing products such as thermometers and thermostats.

HOW DO I PARTICIPATE?

- ≡ Household hazardous waste from towns listed may be brought to the collection at no cost.
- ≡ Residents from towns not participating must pay the contractor in cash or by check. (\$27/5 gallons of liquid waste or up to 20 pounds of dry waste or a combination.)
- ➔ Pack materials in original, secure containers; use boxes or plastic bags, when appropriate.
- ➔ Place materials in trunk or truck bed.
- ➔ Remain in your vehicle.

WHAT ARE THE DANGERS OF IMPROPER DISPOSAL?

Household hazardous wastes are sometimes disposed of improperly by pouring wastes down the drain, on the ground, into storm sewers, or putting them out with the trash. But household hazardous wastes have the potential to injure sanitation workers, contaminate septic tanks or wastewater treatment systems, and present hazards to children and pets if left around the house.
