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2022 IN REVIEW

Apparel Impact recovers 4,235 TONS of textiles from landfills in a historic year of textile recycling and landfill diversion.

Nearly 9 MILLION pounds of clothing, shoes and accessories were diverted from landfills throughout the Northeastern U.S. in what has been the most historic year Apparel Impact has had since their inception seven years ago. With a focus on expanding their service regions throughout Maine, Vermont, New Hampshire, Massachusetts and New York, Apparel Impact saw over 65 municipalities join their recycling program and 100+ non-municipal customers who joined the efforts by hosting Apparel Impact recycling bins; providing the public opportunities to recycle their textiles.

Apparel Impact has invested heavily in providing New England, New York and their communities more locations to recycle their textiles.

In 2022, Apparel Impact invested over \$450,000.00 in these efforts through their purchases of recycling bins, fleet vehicles and by hiring additional team members with a focus on these regions and the mission to divert textile waste.

Apparel Impact has grown to 930 customers and recycling sites with a goal to expand to 1,100 by the end of 2023.


